Dear Friends,

If the scriptures to the left look familiar, it is because they have appeared in every issue of the Columns since April, 2007. They are the words that appear on top of the Manna in the Morning page, which is also found on the home page of the church website.

During the course of my doctoral work (which, hopefully, will be completed and approved for my graduation in May), one of the tools I have discovered which has become the central focus of my research, is the ancient spiritual discipline of *Lectio Divina*. *Lectio Divina* is a Latin term that means “divine reading.” It is an approach to reading Scripture, the Bible, by which we seek to hear God speaking to us. Many people are accustomed to studying the Bible for Sunday School or other Bible study groups; *Lectio Divina* employs a different approach to reading the Bible.

Simply put, we read a passage of scripture in an unhurried manner, so that we can listen for the message God has for us. We ask, “What are you saying to me today, Lord?” As we read the scripture, we find that a word or phrase or image may catch our attention; we pause to reflect and meditate on that word / phrase / image. Then we are moved to speak to God in prayer, perhaps in anguish, confession or sorrow; perhaps in joy, praise, thanksgiving or adoration; perhaps in anger, confusion or hurt; perhaps in quiet confidence, trust or surrender. Then we take a few moments simply to rest in the presence of God who has met us through the scripture.

I hope you will adopt this discipline in your own life. You may try the Manna in the Morning passages, or perhaps you could use this approach as you read through the Psalms, which are wonderfully human in their language—speaking to our own experiences with God and with others.

As I sit down to write this, I have just had a wonderful experience with two small groups that met for eight weeks, using *Lectio Divina* in reading the Psalms, and reflecting together on the comfort, hope, and encouragement we felt from God. In the fall, I plan on starting more “SoulCare” groups like that. Look for announcements later on.

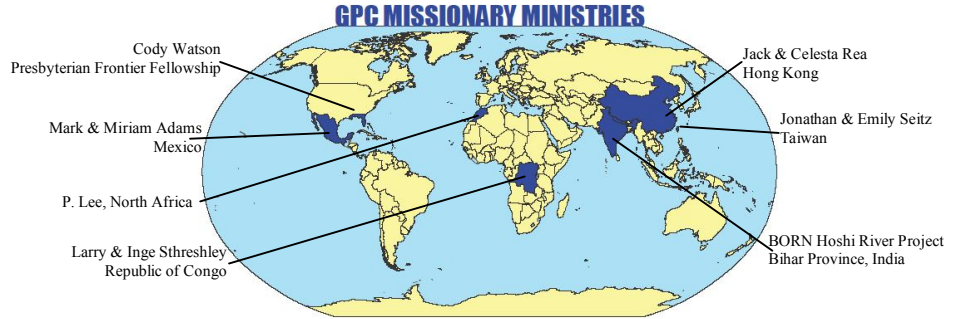

First Quarter Financial Report

Contributions received in the first three months of 2011 exceeded budget by \$4,274 and reflected an increase of \$7,904 over the same period last year. Spending was \$6,195 under budget, but \$15,202 more than last year. Please note that much of the increase in spending over last year occurred because of a change in the timing of certain large payments. The outlook for the year is good.

And I pray that all of you have a most enjoyable Easter this year.

We are having our **Children's Service Project** in April. We will be doing yard maintenance on Saturday, April 9th at 9:30am. MANNA IN THE MORNING

Lectio Divina

Use lectio divina in your daily reading of scripture by reading a few verses of the Bible. Read unhurriedly and listen for the message God has for you. Stay alert to connections to the Spirit that may reveal the passage and what is going on in your life. Once you have heard a word that is meant for you, you are naturally drawn to prayer. Pour your heart to God. Read, reflect, respond and rest — this is the basic rhythm of divine reading.

1. Read the scripture slowly.
2. Reflect on a word or phrase.
3. Respond to what you have read.
4. Rest in God's word.

Won't you take time to each day to let God speak to you through His Word? Listed below is a series of daily readings from the Bible. You are encouraged to spend a few minutes in the morning to let the scriptures soak into your heart. You may choose to begin each day by reading the psalm of the week. There is a single text listed for each weekday and Saturday; the Sunday texts are the Old Testament, Epistle and Gospel lectionary selections that are incorporated into our worship services (Note: during the time between Easter and Pentecost, the Old Testament lesson is replaced by a reading from Acts). One suggestion for daily reading would be to engage with the text through a process known as "Lectio Divina" (a Latin term that simply means "Divine Reading").

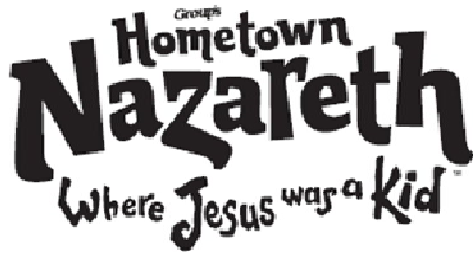
